With the help of the tribe of Judah, David's kingdom was restored and he was back in Jerusalem. But there were those who continued to challenge him as king. Sheba, from King Saul's tribe of Benjamin, stirred up the men of Israel against David. Joab and the king's men were successful in putting down this second rebellion. The final chapters of 2 Samuel include David's reflection on his 40 years as King of Israel.
