The two religious groups, the Pharisees and the Sadducees, often argued over politics and the Law. Their differences can be likened to the Democrats and the Republicans in the United States. Even though both were considered "religious leaders," their views and interpretations of the Law were often on opposite ends of the spectrum. - 11. What were the reactions of the:
 - Teachers of the law? (Luke 20:39)
 - Sadducees? (Luke 20:40)

- 12. Jesus took this opportunity to continue teaching while also revealing the hypocrisy of the religious leaders. What question did he ask them? (Luke 20:41)
- 13. That seems like an easy question to answer except Jesus then quoted Psalm 110:1 where "David calls him 'Lord.'" What was Jesus' second question? (Luke 20:44)
- 14. After asking the questions of the religious leaders, whom did Jesus direct his teaching toward? (Luke 20:45)

- 15. Whom did he warn them to beware of? (Luke 20:46a)
 - Why? (Luke 20:46b-47a)
- 16. What did Jesus say would happen to these men? (Luke 20:47b)

- 17. Then, Jesus looked up from where he was teaching. What did he see? (Luke 21:1 & 2)
- 18. What did he say about that? (Luke 21:3 & 4)
- 19. What do you think Jesus was teaching regarding what God is looking for in tithes and offerings?
