- 5. During the meal, Jesus used this opportunity to warn the Pharisees that they had lost sight of what God said was important. How did he describe the Pharisees? (Luke 11:39)
- 6. Jesus then called them "foolish" which is a huge cultural insult. How did he say they would be truly clean? (Luke 11:40 & 41)
- 7. Jesus continued speaking using a series of "woes" to warn them that unless they change, God will judge them harshly. Why did Jesus pronounce these first three woes on the Pharisees?

 - Why does Jesus say his followers are not to be afraid?

Acknowledging Christ - Luke 12:8-12

- 14. Why does Jesus say it is important for his followers to acknowledge him before men?
- 15. The next verse is often quoted and difficult to understand when taken out of context. Jesus said, "Anyone who blasphemes against the Holy Spirit will not be forgiven (12:10b.)" To whom was Jesus speaking? (Luke 11:39 & 46)
- 16. What specifically had they just done? (Luke 11:15, 19 & 20)
- 17. Do you see a warning for us today?
- 18. What do you think was the importance of Jesus' teaching his disciples on hypocrisy, fear and trust, and acknowledging him before men? (Luke 12:11-12)
