

Joshua's Charge to Israel  
Lesson 8  
Joshua 22-24

Israel had taken possession of the land and God gave them rest on every side. Having fulfilled their promise to Moses and God, the Transjordan tribes were ready to return home and settle in their inheritance.

**The Eastern Tribes - 22:1-34**

1. "You have done all that Moses the servant of the Lord commanded..." 22:2. What had Moses commanded and why? (Numbers 32:5, 20-22)
2. What was Joshua's charge to the Transjordan tribes as they got ready to return home? (Joshua 22: 2-5)
3. Why do you think Joshua said to be very careful to do these things?
4. They went into battle empty handed. How do they return? (Joshua 22:7, 8)
5. As a final act before crossing over the Jordan, what did they do? (Joshua 22:10)
6. What was the reaction of the other 9 ½ tribes when they found out? (Joshua 22: 11, 12)
7. Israel sent a delegation across the Jordan to question the Transjordan tribes. Why were they willing to go to war against their brothers? (Joshua 22:13-18)

**Joshua's Farewell - 23:1-16**

12. Joshua was approaching 110 years of age. His life was coming to a close so he called together the leaders of Israel. Like Moses before him, he recounted God's faithfulness. What did he say in Joshua 23:3-5?
13. Joshua encouraged them to "be strong", then gave several warnings. List them. (Joshua 23:6 - 8)

24. The people seemed to be on one of their "mountain top" experiences. You can almost feel the electricity in the air. Explain what you think was the meaning of Joshua's words in verses 19 and 20.
25. The challenge continued as the people said, "we hear you Joshua, we will serve the LORD." Joshua then called the people as "witnesses against themselves". What was the purpose of a witness?
26. Joshua gave them one final instruction. What was it? (Joshua 24:23)
27. What did the people say? (Joshua 24:24)
28. How many times did they make this commitment? (Joshua 24:16-24)

29. What were Joshua's final acts? (Joshua 24:25-27)

30. Joshua's death is recorded in verses 28-31. What was said about God's servant Joshua?

The book of Joshua closed with Joshua, like Moses, being called a servant of the LORD. He faithfully served God and Israel all his life. The mention of Joseph (who died 200 years before) helped close out an era. This fulfilled the promise made by the sons of Jacob to Joseph that they would bury his bones in the land of Canaan. With this promise fulfilled along with the deaths of Joshua and Eleazar, a new era began for Israel - possession of the Promised Land.
