Joshua sent the army to capture their cities, and then executed the kings as God had commanded in Deut. 21:22 – 23. The remainder of chapter 10 records the battles fought to conquer the Southern cities of Canaan.

- 11. What was the outcome of this battle? (vs. 8)
- 12. Why was this battle successful? (vs. 9)
- 13. What did Joshua do next? (vs. 10,11)
- 14. How important were these cities Joshua conquered? (vs. 12)
- 15. Verse 13 states only the city of Hazor was burned. Why do you think that was so?

- 16. What does verse 15 say about Joshua's three campaigns of conquest?
- 17. Verse 18 said that "Joshua waged war for a long time." Using Caleb's ages as recorded in Joshua 14:7 and 10 and Deuteronomy 2:14, approximately how long did it take?
- 18. What was the result of Joshua's obedience to God? (vs. 23)

- 29. Which of the Transjordan tribes received the land of Sihon the Amorite King? (vs. 15-23)
