Revelation 17 The Woman and the Beast Lesson 20

Because of His desire that all would be saved, God has revealed Himself to the world in many ways. He sent three sets of seven judgments giving many opportunities to repent and turn to Him. But when the people refuse and choose instead to worship Satan and the Beast over the Almighty God, from His throne in heaven God declared, "It is done!" (Revelation 16:17) At this point in the narrative, Satan and the kings of the world have gathered together at Armageddon to go to war against the Lord Almighty; but before the final battle is revealed, John was given a vision of God's judgment upon "Babylon the Great" and "The Beast".
